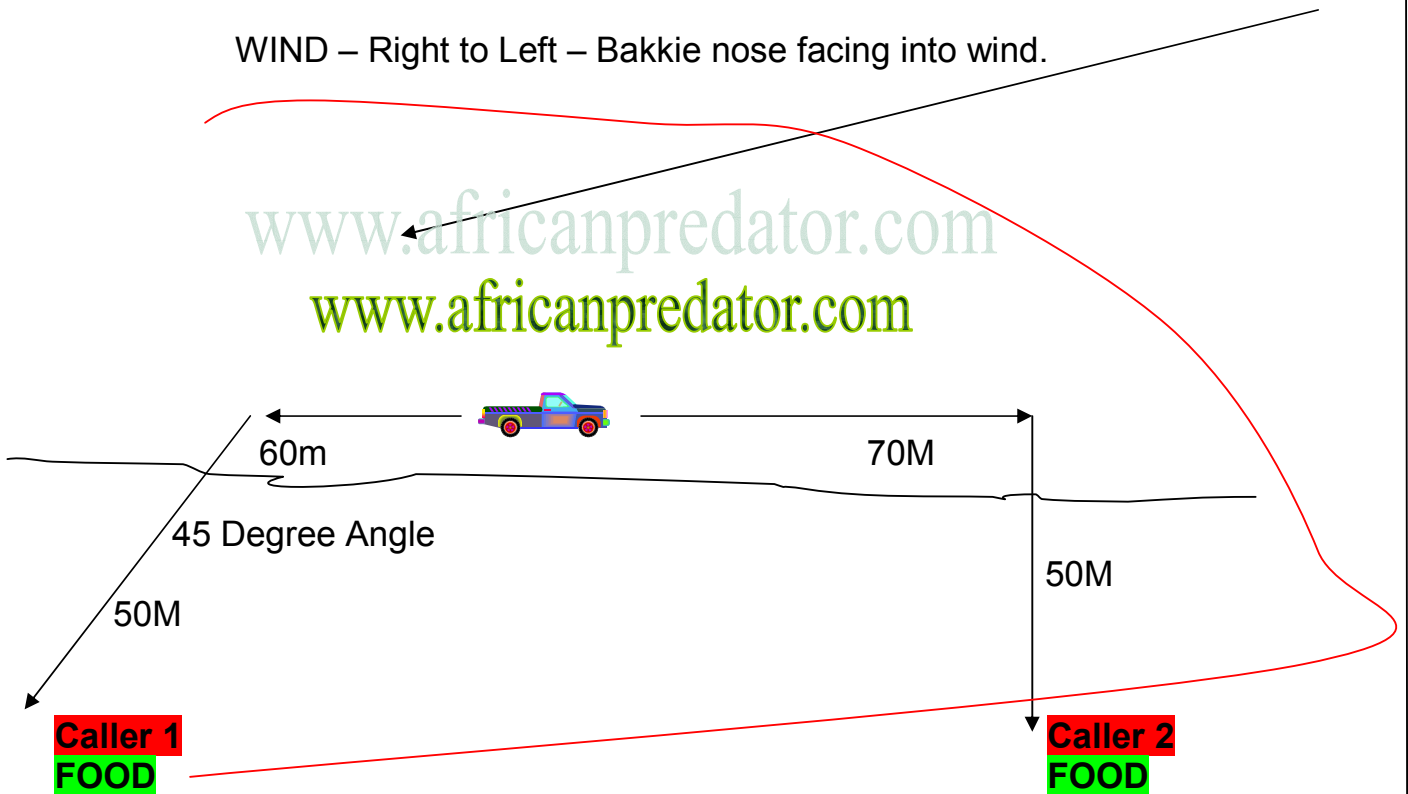


CONFUSION LAYOUT PLAN

WIND – Right to Left – Bakkie nose facing into wind.



This set up, will confuse a jackal, he will come in and will need to bypass on the left around the bakkie offering a shot or on the RIGHT he will have to come past two food sounds.

It is active sounds you need to make and the distressed rabbit is moving around thus causing a more realistic set up, he will have to look for that rabbit, and have to do a lot of work before getting downwind of you. Pull the bakkie OFF the road.

THE RED LINE shows all the ground that a jackal will have to bypass and not show any attention to before getting downwind of you, he will have to do a lot of thinking to not show before getting downwind, these confusion sets really work well.

Caller #1 is 60M behind bakkie, 50M to the side at a 45 degree angle, **Caller #2** is 70m into wind, 50M to the SAME side at NO angle.

This leaves the ground on the left wide open for a predator wanting to approach and the truck is in the centre waiting for him. This style of calling works better if using a small quad or platform with no big bakkie hidden away etc.
